Layout Plans of Ships, Machinery, Equipment, and Works: Introduction

Definitions: "The arrangement or plan of something, such as a ship or shipyard". Usually a written document on paper, linen, or cloth.

Layout plans are an essential part of the design and construction process. They are now largely superseded by CAD electronic systems.
