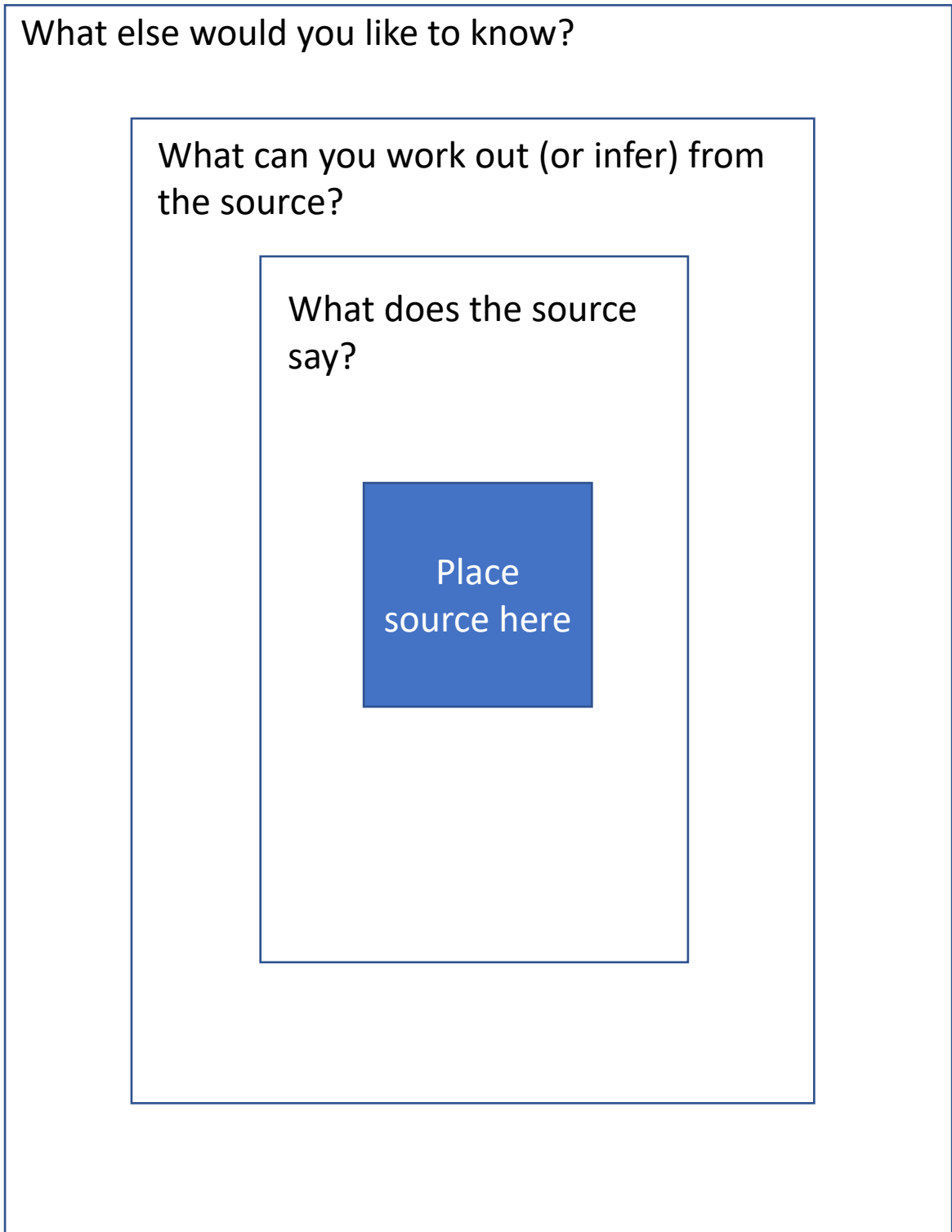


# Layers of Inference Diagram
